HOW TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Do you have a Social Security Number?

Complete the FAFSA



Determine who the parent(s) is for financial aid (FAFSA) purposes.

- Parent information on the FAFSA can <u>only be</u> from biological or adoptive parent – EVEN if you do not live with your parents.
- If you live with both parents or parent is remarried, information for both parents is required (including step-parent)
- If you live with only one parent (parent is not remarried), only information for that parent is required.



Gather the documents needed to complete the FAFSA

<u>Note:</u> Parent(s) do not need to have a social security number and/or file an income tax return in order to do the FAFSA.



Create Username & Password - fsaid.ed.gov

The student and one parent will need a username and password to complete the financial aid.

Note: If parent already has an FSAID, do not have to create another one



Log into FAFSA.gov & complete

Use your (the Student's) username and password to log in

You will need to complete the financial aid application every year that you attend college and you will need username and passwords to log in to apply for financial aid.

The parent's username and password (username & password) will not be used until the end of the application when it asks for electronic signatures.
