



Early College High School Admission Policy

La Feria ISD is proud to bring the Early College High School Program to its students. The Early College High School Program is an open-enrollment program that allows students least likely to attend college with the opportunity to earn a high school diploma, an associate degree, or up to 60 college credit hours while being part of an accelerated instruction program and a rigorous curriculum during their high school career.

All first time ninth grade students are highly encouraged to apply and complete the Early College High School Student Application for consideration for admission. Admission decisions are not based on state assessment scores, discipline history, teacher recommendations, counselor recommendations, parent or student essays, minimum grade point average (GPA), nor any other criteria that will create barriers for student enrollment/admission.

La Feria ISD will follow TEA's College Career Readiness School Model recruitment and enrollment processes to identify, recruit, and enroll subpopulations in addition to those who are at risk as defined by PEIMS and those that are historically underrepresented in college courses.
